PADDLING ETIQUETTE

Please follow these rules for your safety and paddling pleasure.

When paddling thru the harbor, stay to one side - don't weave between moored boats.

Stay out of marked boat channels used by power and sail boats. If you must cross, do so quickly at a 90 degree angle when the channel is clear, like crossing a street.

Always yield the right of way to power and sail boats. Assume they cannot see you and act accordingly.

Respect private property and protected wildlife habitat. Land only where permitted.

Do not land at public or private swim beaches that have posted lifeguards. Check local rules.

Carry out all of your waste and pick up floating litter for proper disposal.

STANDARD BOATING SIGNALS

Distress (Emergency): Wave one blade of your paddle vertically, high over head. If you've lost your paddle, raise and lower both arms outstretched (same signal boaters use). Three whistle or airhorn blasts is the universal distress signal, but in wind people may not hear a whistle.


I'm Okay: Tap the top of your head with a hand, elbow bent (same signal divers use). Or, blow two short blasts on your whistle.

Safe on Shore: Let people know your kayak has not washed up without you! Use a cockpit cover or place your paddle securely and visibly across the cockpit or deck if you leave your kayak unattended. Be sure you are above high tide line or tie your kayak securely!

Directions to Rockport location

Take Route 128 North to Gloucester.

At the Grant Circle rotary take 2nd right on RT-128 at sign reading "RT-128 N to E. Gloucester / Rockport".

At Blackburn Circle rotary take 2nd right again on RT-128 at sign reading "RT-128 to Gloucester / Rockport".

Turn left on RT-127 and go 3.1 miles

Bear right on Broadway and go 0.4 miles

Turn left on Mt Pleasant St. at the little lighthouse in the center of the road. Start looking for a parking space!

Turn right on Bearskin Neck. Tuna Wharf is the 2nd wharf on the right and is a pedestrian walkway (no cars allowed).

There is limited parking on Bearskin Neck, and NONE on Tuna Wharf! Please consider parking at the free lot on Rt. 127 and taking the shuttle into town. We are a 10-minute walk from the Rockport train station.
